

We are looking at how best to document children's learning through play, supporting the children's interests and using these to document their successes and growth over time.

We are also looking into other seeds that are ideal for planting now, any ideas appreciated!

March – Exploring the Rock Pools, this was a fun outing to the beach, we got the tides just right, with the tide being low there was a lot of active exploring happening and some great sea treasures found. Some very wet, but happy children at the end of the morning!
